Certification Trade Mark application 1914662 lodged by Humane Farm Animal Care Pty Ltd (HFAC).

In response to the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission's (ACCC) Initial Assessment, the applicant, Humane Farm Animal Care Pty Ltd HFAC), has made significant and substantive changes to the rules relating to the above Certification Trade Mark (CTM).

The applicant has completely revised the CTM rules for specific use in Australia bringing them in line with Australian standards, guidelines and model codes of practices.

The applicant has appointed Dr Ellen Jongman of the Animal Welfare Science Centre, Faculty of Veterinary and Agricultural Science, University of Melbourne to its scientific committee. She will now act as the contact person in Australia for certification applications, on-site inspections and any dispute matters.

The applicant has assured that it will never require compliance to a standard if it does not meet or exceed the Australian standards, guidelines and regulations. In the unlikely event that an HFAC rule conflicts with an Australian Standard an automatic modification of the rules will take place to ensure compliance with the Australian standards.

The applicant has provided a summary document (Responses to ACCC Initial Assessment and Amendments to Rules) that directly addresses the concerns raised by the ACCC through both substantive responses and amendments to the rules. In addition, the applicant has provided a comparison chart comparing paraphrased versions of Australian rules against HFAC's rules (Aus vs HFAC Welfare Comparison). Both those documents are attached. A completed Certification Mark Rules Checklist is also attached.
