In response to points raised by stakeholders in consultation, we are proposing revised variations to the FOAS and FTAS service descriptions. Essentially, the proposed variations would more closely align wording with that used for the Mobile Terminating Access Service (which does not refer to industry guidelines) and continue to make the service descriptions technology neutral, with the exception of pre-selection and over-ride/access codes which we understand are only provided over the PSTN.

Good morning,

As you know, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) is holding a public inquiry relevantly about whether to extend, further extend, revoke, vary, allow to expire or remake the declarations of the fixed originating access service (FOAS) and fixed terminating access service (FTAS).

On 20 December 2023, the ACCC released a <u>draft inquiry report</u>. Amongst other things, in the draft report the ACCC expressed the preliminary view that extending the expiry dates of the FOAS and FTAS declarations for a further 5 years, with no changes to the service descriptions, will promote the long-term interests of end-users.

The ACCC is now proposing to vary the service descriptions in the FOAS and FTAS to include a reference to Session Initiation Protocol (SIP) Interconnection so that it is clear this is captured by the service descriptions. The proposed variation follows the release of Communications Alliance Ltd's <u>Industry Guideline G672:2023</u> in December 2023 and <u>submissions received in response to the ACCC's combined declaration inquiry draft report</u>.

The proposed revised service descriptions for the FOAS and FTAS declarations, reflecting the proposed amendments, are **attached**.
