Hi Vyt and Geoff

Following on from your update about the DMO determination date we would like to provide you with a couple of suggestions for consideration and wording of the Regs amendment. When the previous consideration was 21 May we were considering whether we could publish the next business day after a weekend and we think it would be good to make this clear in the Regs. Even if the date isn't a weekend this year, it would be good for future years.

- You could consider the following form of words: *XX May or if that day falls on a weekend or a public holiday, the AER must publish the Determination no later than the next business day after XX May.*



- There is also a potential issue about the commencement of DMO prices – the Regs require that they commence 56 days after the determination date. We would need a consequential amendment to ensure they commenced on 1 July.
