I have some concerns about the first quote attributed to ACCC. What I think we are trying to achieve by this quote/paragraph is to explain what is wrong with Birubi's conduct.

CURRENT "Birubi's alleged conduct is damaging as it misleads people who think they are buying genuine Aboriginal art. This has the potential to undermine the integrity of Aboriginal art, and negatively impact Indigenous artists who deserve to be paid for their works," ACCC Deputy Chair Delia Rickard said."

I think the current version of the para is too strong and doesn't reflect the make-up of the products:

- Trisha Mason receives 5% of the royalty
- it is art that is created by an Aboriginal artist

POSSIBLE ALTERNATIVE: "Birubi's alleged conduct is damaging as it misleads people who think they are buying a product that is made by an Indigenous Australian in Australia. This has the potential to undermine the integrity of Indigenous art and negatively impact Indigenous artists as authentic products just can't compete."

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The above suggestion on possible alternative is not something that I am tied to, but I think the current version risks inaccuracies in our media release.
