The National Copyright Unit - CB10000484 - ACCC does not object

The ACCC has assessed the collective bargaining notification (CB10000484) lodged by The National Copyright Unit on 15 November 2022 on behalf of the Copyright Advisory Group for TAFEs (CAG TAFE) and its members, Victorian TAFEs, and other TAFE entities who may elect to join in the future and does not object to the notification. Protection from legal action provided by the notification commenced on 29 November 2022.

In addition, the ACCC has decided that it is appropriate for the notification to remain in force for ten years until 14 November 2032. The ACCC's Statement of Reasons is available on [the public register](#).

Application for review

Under section 101A of the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010*, a person dissatisfied with the ACCC's decision in relation to the period of the notification may apply to the Australian Competition Tribunal (the Tribunal) for a review of that decision. An application for review must be made to the Tribunal on or before 23 February 2023. The Tribunal is a separate body from the ACCC and is located within the Federal Court of Australia. The ACCC may review a notification at any time if circumstances change, or the ACCC receives further information. A notification can be revoked if the ACCC is satisfied that the public benefits no longer outweigh the public detriments.
