Re: Commonwealth Bank and Ors application for authorisation AA1000640 – Applicants' response to ACCC's draft determination

On 18 September 2023, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (**the ACCC**) issued a draft determination in respect of the application for authorisation lodged by the Commonwealth Bank of Australia, Westpac Banking Corporation, Australia and New Zealand Banking Group Limited, National Australia Bank Limited and Macquarie Bank Limited (**the Applicants**) on 17 April 2023. For the reasons set out in its draft determination, the ACCC proposed to deny authorisation.

Authorisation is sought to make and give effect to agreements and arrangements to establish a voluntary industry-wide program for participating mortgage lenders to jointly procure assurance reviews of the compliance systems and standards of participating mortgage aggregators (the **Aggregator Assurance Program**).

On 13 December 2023, the Applicants provided a submission in response to the draft determination, which is **attached** and available on the ACCC's authorisations public register. The Applicants' submission also includes a number of attachments which, due to their size, have not been included with this letter. These attachments are also available on the public register. The Applicants' submission includes details of modifications to the Aggregator Assurance Program that the Applicants are proposing to make.

This letter is to invite you to comment on the Applicants' submission in response to the draft determination, including the modifications to the Aggregator Assurance Program that the Applicants are proposing. You are welcome to pass this letter on to others who may wish to make submissions.
