7-Eleven Stores Pty Limited application for authorisation AA1000500 - Making a submission

On 9 April 2020 the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) received an application for authorisation from 7-Eleven Stores Pty Limited (**7-Eleven**).

7-Eleven has applied for authorisation to approach some of its franchisees (Franchisees), and if they agree, to enter into arrangements with those Franchisees to either temporarily close or reduce the trading hours of certain stores. This may include stores operated by its Franchisees, and stores operated by 7-Eleven (or through its sister entity, Convenience Holdings Pty Limited) (corporate-owned stores) (the **Proposed Conduct)**.

7-Eleven advised that the purpose of the Proposed Conduct is to assist 7-Eleven and its Franchisees to respond to and endure the COVID-19 pandemic in a cost-efficient manner, while supporting 7-Eleven's customers. It has requested that authorisation be for 6 months from when the ACCC makes its final decision in this matter.

On 24 April 2020, the ACCC granted interim authorisation to allow the parties to commence the Proposed Conduct while the ACCC considers the application for authorisation.

7-Eleven's application for authorisation and supporting submission and the ACCC's interim authorisation decision can be accessed via the public register entry for this matter on the ACCC's website (https://www.accc.gov.au/public-registers/authorisations-and-notifications-registers/authorisations-register/7-eleven-stores-pty-limited).

Invitation to make a submission

The ACCC is now conducting a public consultation process on the Proposed Conduct and invites you to make a submission commenting on 7-Eleven's application for authorisation, including

- the likely public benefits and detriments of the conduct the subject of the authorisation
- the appropriate time period for the conduct to be authorised for, and
- whether any conditions should be placed on the authorisation of the conduct.

We request submissions by Friday 22 May 2020.

You are welcome to pass this letter on to others who may wish to make submissions.

How to make a submission

Submissions should be emailed to adjudication@accc.gov.au with the subject '7-Eleven - AA1000500 - Submission'.

We recognise that the COVID-19 situation may be causing disruptions to your normal operations. For this reason, we are taking a flexible approach to receiving feedback on the Proposed Conduct. You may wish to contact us by phone to discuss your views or submission before the deadline. If you would like to provide comments orally, please contact Rebecca Hall on (07) 3835 4623 to organise a suitable time.

Submissions, including a record of oral submissions, will be placed on the ACCC's public register on the internet unless you have made a request (with reasons) for us to exclude part or all of the submission from the public register (see Guidelines for Excluding Information from the Public Register for more information on how to make a request and how we assess requests).

9 April 2020	Lodgement of application and supporting submission, including request for interim authorisation.
24 April 2020	Interim decision.

22 May 2020	Closing date for submissions on the substantive application for authorisation from interested parties.
June 2020	Applicant responds to issues raised in the public consultation process.
June/July 2020	Draft determination.
July 2020	Public consultation on draft determination including any conference if called.
September 2020	Final determination.
