Hunter Resource Recovery applications for authorisation (AA1000670) - interested party consultation

On 26 April 2024, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) received an application for authorisation from Hunter Resource Recovery (**HRR**). This letter is to invite you to comment. You are welcome to pass this letter on to others who may wish to make submissions.

HRR, on behalf of itself, and its Member Councils, (Cessnock City Council, Lake Macquarie City Council, Maitland City Council and Singleton Shire Council), is seeking authorisation¹ under the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Cth), to enter and give effect to a new, short-term contract with Solo Resource Recovery, with respect to collection, processing and distribution of recyclables on a unified basis for its Member Councils.

HRR is seeking authorisation for 3 years, from June 2025.

HRR has sought interim authorisation with respect to this application above.
