Pilbara ISOCo Limited's application for authorisation AA1000623 – interested party consultation

On 7 November 2022, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) received an application for authorisation from Pilbara ISOCo Limited (the Applicant). This letter is to invite you to comment. You are welcome to pass this letter on to others who may wish to make submissions.

The Applicant is the independent system operator (ISO) for the North-West Interconnected System, an electricity grid in Western Australia's Pilbara region. The Pilbara Regime is a specialist regulatory regime created by the Western Australia government to cover the access and use of certain covered electricity networks in the Pilbara region of Western Australia. The Pilbara Regime gives the ISO and various other persons powers and responsibilities in order to:

- facilitate access to the covered networks in order to promote competition in the generation and supply of electricity, and
- provide for the integrated operation of the various networks to maintain and power system security and reliability.

The Applicant is seeking authorisation¹ for itself and on behalf of three separate classes of current and future participants in the Pilbara Regime under the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Cth). Authorisation would give it legal protection from competition laws to engage in any conduct that is required or permitted by the Pilbara Regime to allow for its implementation and facilitation. Further details of the proposed conduct are available in the application for authorisation.

The Applicant is seeking authorisation for a period of 10 years. A full copy of the application for authorisation is available on the ACCC's authorisations public register.

Making a submission

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the application for authorisation. In making your submission, please provide information, evidence and views about the likely public benefits, effects on competition and any other public detriment that you consider will result from the proposed conduct.

If you intend to provide a submission, please do so by 7 December 2022. If you wish to request an extension, please contact us on the details below as early as possible.
