National Honda Deal Council Limited application for authorisation AA1000528–interested party consultation

On 21 August 2020, the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) received an application for authorisation from National Honda Dealer Council Limited (**NHDC**). This letter is to invite you to comment. You are welcome to pass this letter on to others who may wish to make submissions.

NHDC is seeking authorisation¹ under the *Competition and Consumer Act 2010* (Cth). Authorisation would give it legal protection to engage in collective bargaining with Honda Australia Pty Ltd (**Honda**) on behalf of Honda Dealers identified in the application.

Honda has announced that it intends to replace its individual agreements with dealers with a new agency model (the **New Model**), whereby dealers would engage with customers as agents of Honda. The NHDC is seeking to collectively bargain on behalf of dealers in respect of the terms of the New Model.

NHDC is seeking authorisation for a term of 11 years from the ACCC's final authorisation. A full copy of the application for authorisation is available on the ACCC's <u>authorisations public</u> register.

Interim authorisation

NHDC has also requested interim authorisation to allow it to engage in collective bargaining with Honda regarding the terms of the New Model prior to the ACCC's final determination in relation to the substantive application for authorisation.

Making a submission

The ACCC invites you to make a submission on the application for authorisation. In making your submission, please provide information, evidence and views about the likely public benefits, effects on competition and any other public detriment that you consider will result from the proposed conduct.

If you intend to provide a submission, please do so by **15 September 2020**. If you wish to request an extension, please contact us on the details below as early as possible. Submissions after the due date (or after any extension granted) may not be taken into account. Submissions in relation to interim authorisation should be provided by

3 September 2020. Extensions are not normally granted for submissions on interim authorisation.

Please email your submission to adjudication@accc.gov.au, with the subject 'AA1000528 – National Honda Deal Council Limited – submission'. Alternatively, if you would like to provide comments orally, please contact Hannah Ransom via the details at the end of this letter.

Your submission **will** be placed on the ACCC's <u>authorisations public register on the internet</u> unless you have made a request (with reasons) for us to exclude part or all of the submission from the public register. (see <u>Guidelines for Excluding Information from the Public Register for more information on how to make a request and how we assess requests).</u>
