Equinix and others application for authorisation AA1000558 — draft determination and interim authorisation

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (the **ACCC**) has issued a draft determination in respect of the application for authorisation, including interim authorisation, lodged by Equinix (Australia) Enterprises Pty Ltd (**Equinix**) and others on 15 June 2021.

For the reasons set out in its draft determination, the ACCC proposes to grant authorisation for 24 years.

The ACCC has also granted interim authorisation to enable the electricity joint buying group (comprising Equinix, HSBC, Nike Australia Pty Limited, Goldman Sachs and H&M) to conduct the joint tender process and commence negotiations, but not enter into supply contracts, while the ACCC is considering the substantive application.

A copy of the ACCC's draft determination is attached and also available on the ACCC's <u>Authorisations public register</u>.

Next steps

Once the ACCC issues a draft determination, the Applicants or any interested party may make a written submission and/or request that the ACCC convene a 'pre-decision conference'.

Making a submission

If you wish to make a submission in response to the ACCC's draft determination, please lodge your submission by **29 July 2021**. Submissions should be emailed to exemptions@accc.gov.au with the subject 'AA1000558 – Equinix and others – submission'. If you prefer to make an oral submission, please contact Nissa Burns via the details at the end of this letter.

The ACCC will consider any submissions it receives, including any oral submissions made at a pre-decision conference (should one be called - see below), and will then release a final determination in relation to this application.

Submissions will be placed on the ACCC's public register subject to any request for exclusion. See the ACCC's <u>Guidelines for excluding information from the public register</u>.

Optional pre-decision conference

In some cases the applicant or an interested party requests that the ACCC convene a predecision conference in relation to its draft determination. If a conference is called it will be open to the applicant and interested parties to attend and make oral submissions in relation to the draft determination. Conferences are conducted informally and while legal or professional advisers are able to attend they are not entitled to participate in the discussion.

If you wish the ACCC to hold a pre-decision conference in relation to the draft determination, you must notify the ACCC in writing by **29 July 2021** by email to exemptions@accc.gov.au.

August/September 2021	Final determination.
